
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








































Why did you decide (on your own) to limit discussions about political and social issues in class?

to build trust and engage parents in conversations about their children's learning


#### **REACTIVE STRATEGY**

- 1 Refer back to core values. YOUR OWN

- 2 Maintain your composure. Know when not to respond.
- 3 Don't go it alone. Get cover.

# How to navigate polarizing debates

- 4 Focus on the issues, not the players.
- 5 Don't be dismissive of opposing viewpoints.
- 6 Don't retreat on important work just to avoid backlash.
- 7 Strengthen relationships and trust with families across the ideological spectrum.
