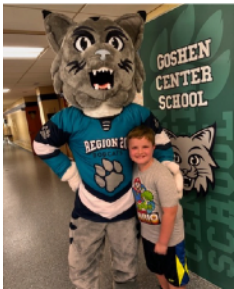

- ◆ A current resume.
- ◆ A minimum of three recent letters of professional reference.
- ◆ Undergraduate and graduate transcripts and a copy of professional certification.

About Region 20

The four towns of Region 20 are located in the beautiful hills of northwestern Connecticut. The county is a recreation destination and agricultural area.

Goshen is home to about 3,165 residents on about 45.6 square miles. The town boasts many ponds, lakes, and reservoirs.

Litchfield is a classic New England town that has preserved its historic character. Home to about 8,200, the town spans 56.8 square miles.

Morris, a town of 2,270 residents on 18.7 square miles, consists of farmland, protected open space, and rolling hill country surrounding Bantam Lake, the largest natural lake in Connecticut.

White Memorial Foundation, 4,000 acres of preserved forest, fields, and wetlands, is located in both Litchfield and Morris.

Warren, a rural town named for Revolutionary War General Joseph Warren, is home to about 1,352 on 27.6 square miles.

Region 20 Public Schools

Region 20 is the school district created to educate students from Goshen, Litchfield, Morris and Warren, CT. The towns of Goshen, Morris and Warren were part of the Region 6 school district beginning in 1955.

On June 28, 2022, residents of the three Region 6 towns and Litchfield voted to merge. The new district opened its doors this past fall.

Our Schools:

A total of 1559 students are educated in the Region 20 public schools, including 181 non-residents.

- * Goshen Center School, Goshen: PK-Grade 5 (114 students)
- * Litchfield Center School, Litchfield: PK- Grade 3 (221 students)
- * Litchfield Intermediate School: Grades 4 & 5 (121 students)
- * James Morris School, Morris: PK-Grade 5 (102 students)
- * Warren School, Warren: PK-Grade 5 (48 students)
- * Plumb Hill Middle School, Litchfield: Grades 6-8 (352 students)
- * Lakeview High School, Litchfield: Grades 9-12 (586 students)



Region 20 also accepts students in its **nationally recognized Agriscience Program** from sending towns of Burlington, Harwinton, Plymouth, Terryville, Thomaston, & Torrington.
